Government of Canada Supports Amicitia France-Canada Monument in Ottawa

Beechwood Cemetery receives funding through Veterans Affairs Canada's Commemorative Partnership Program

Canadians in uniform have served our country with bravery, honour and dignity—some making the ultimate sacrifice. We continue to preserve their legacy and recognize their contributions and sacrifices as a way to pass the torch of remembrance to future generations.

The Honourable Mona Fortier, Minister of Middle Class Prosperity, Associate Minister of Finance and Member of Parliament for Ottawa—Vanier, with Marie-France Lalonde, President of the Canada-France Interparliamentary Association and Member of Parliament for Orléans, announced Government of Canada funding of \$25,000 toward the construction of the Amicitia France-Canada Monument.

This initiative commemorates the shared history between Canada and France. It will stand as a lasting testament to those in uniform who have served and continue to serve around the world in times of war, conflict and peace. The Honourable Mona Fortier and Marie-France Lalonde made the announcement on behalf of the Honourable Lawrence MacAulay, Minister of Veterans Affairs and Associate Minister of National Defence.

The monument will be set along a pathway near a portion of the Canadian Shield overlooking the National Military Cemetery in Beechwood Cemetery. Grey granite for the monument will be sourced from local quarries.

Quick Facts

- Beechwood Cemetery is receiving up to \$25,000 in Community War Memorial funding through Veterans Affairs Canada's Commemorative Partnership Program for the Monument Amicita France-Canada.
- Canada and France work jointly in military, police and peacekeeping operations in remote and conflicted regions around the world.
- Veterans Affairs Canada honours those who served Canada in times of war, military conflict and peace, and to keep the memory of their achievements and sacrifices alive for all Canadians.
- The Commemorative Partnership Program is a modest funding program that helps communities across the country honour the contributions and sacrifice of those who have served in Canada's military over the years.
